Mangano and Venditto Break Ground for Intralogic's New Global Command Center for School and Public Safety

Currently, IntraLogic works with Nassau BOCES to provide the Nassau County Police Department with live access to camera feeds.

IntraLogic Solution's new global command center, which will open in 2015 is located at 511 Ocean Avenue in Massapequa will be 17,000 square feet and the largest in the tri-state area. It will serve as a hub to monitor the video feeds and security operations of their clientele including school districts, government agencies, municipalities, and global organizations. IntraLogic will be manufacturing the new *One Button Lockdown* system in this new state of the art facility and distributing and selling the system to schools across the nation.

County Executive Mangano stated: "I am proud that with the help of the Nassau County Industrial Development Agency, we were able to keep IntraLogic, and their jobs, in Nassau County. Intralogic already employs 32 people and will be creating 13 permanent jobs in Nassau County through this 2 million dollar expansion project.
